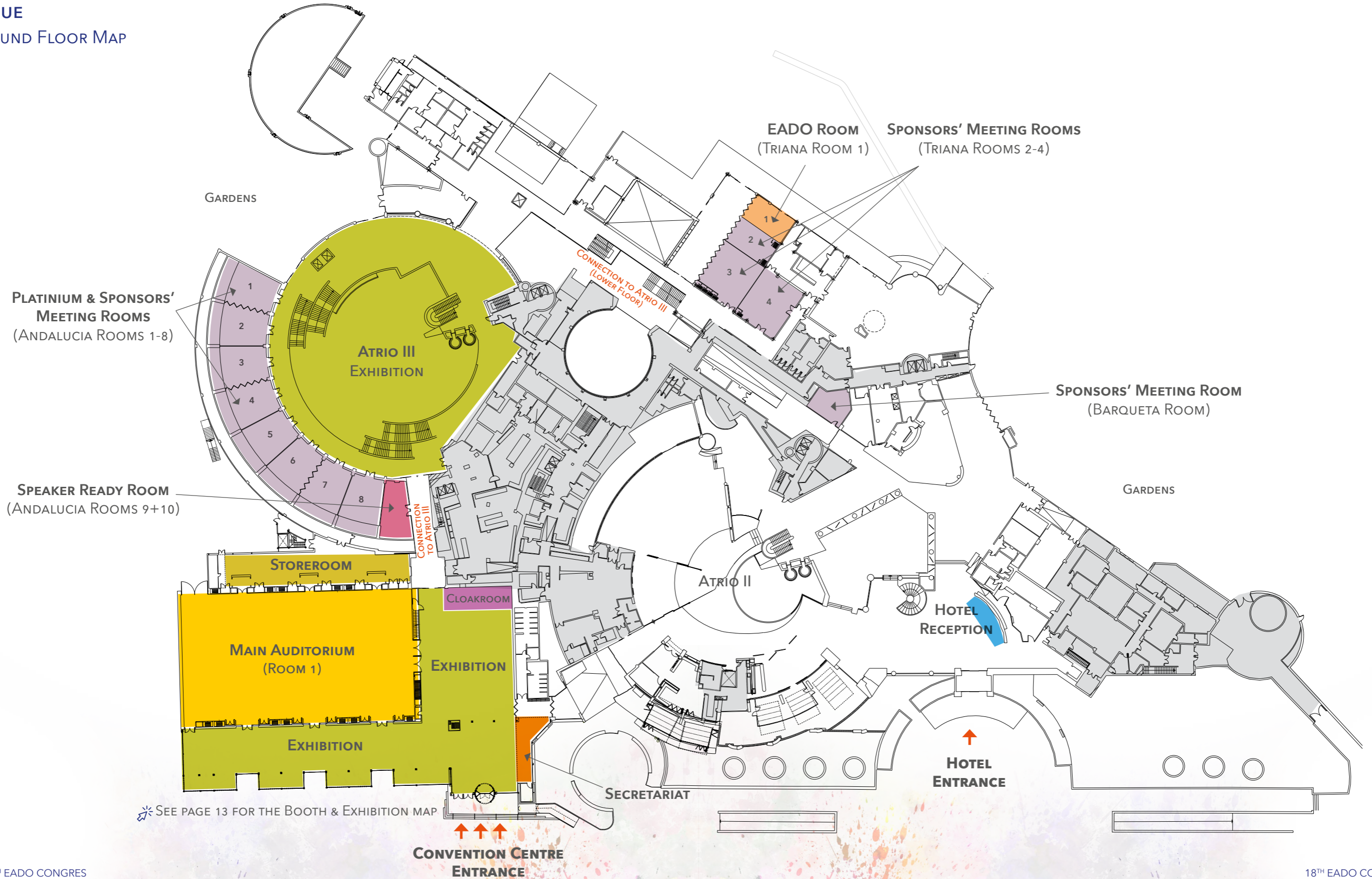

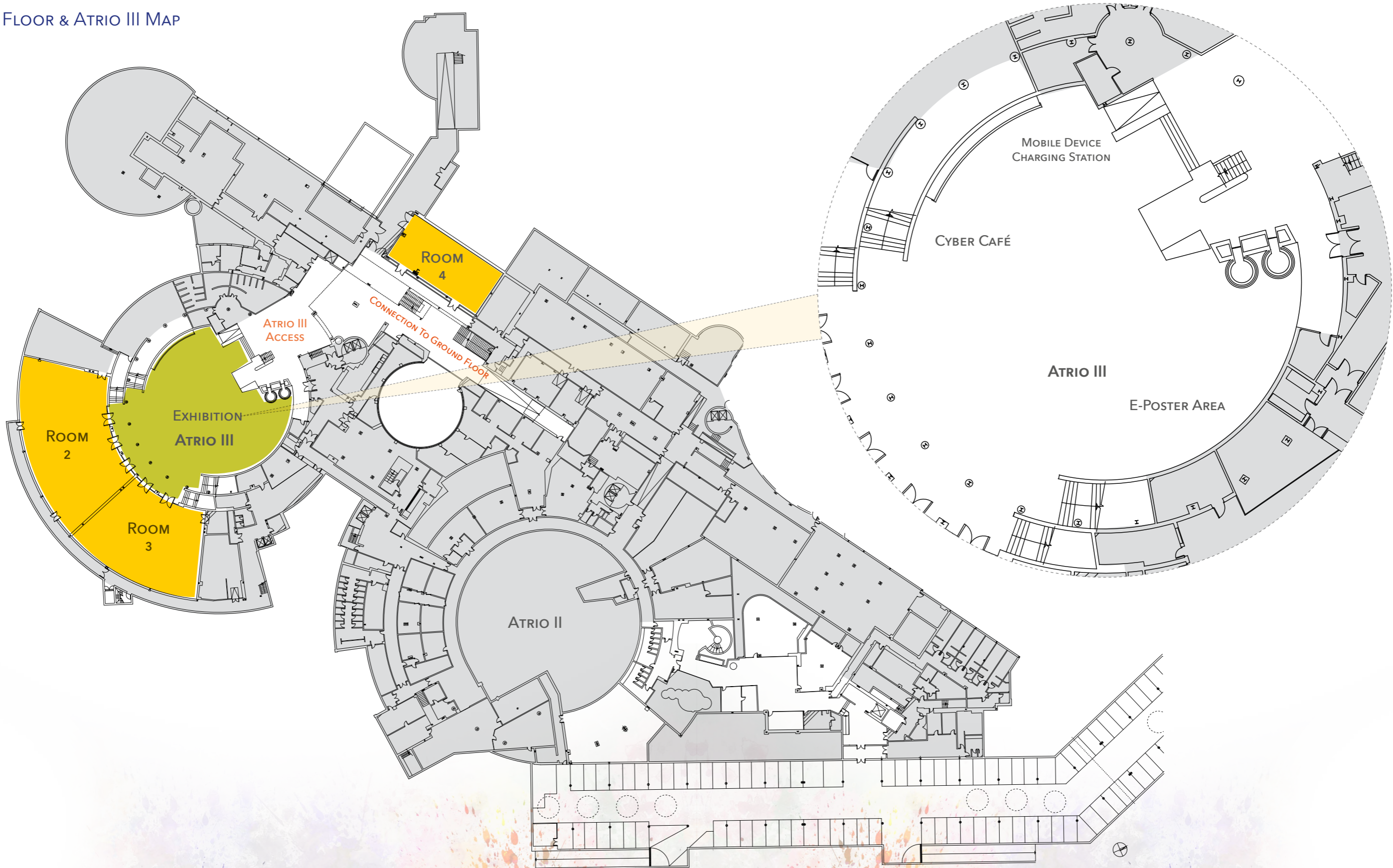
VENUE GROUND FLOOR MAP
